King George County, to wit: We, Hazlewood Thompson, James M. Edwards and Fred'k. F. Ninde and John D. Owens Commissioners and Conductor, for holding the election directed by law to be held on the last on the fourth Thursday in May 1861, at Shiloh precinct in said county, do hereby certify that on this day, to wit: the said fourth Thursday in May 1861, we opened a poll at said precinct, in the manner prescribed by law, to take the sense of the qualified voters upon the ratification or rejection of "An Ordinance to repeal the ratification of the Constitution of the United States of America, by the state of Virginia, and to resume all the rights and powers granted under said Constitution," adopted in Convention at the city of Richmond, on the 17th day of April, 1861— and the following is a statemetn of the vote as exhibited by the poll books: For Ratification 130 votes; For Rejection 1 votes:
