Land Office Military Warrant, Issued to Moses Wade, June 12, 1783

Land Office Military WARRANT, No. 795

To the principal SURVEYOR of the Lands set apart for the Officers and Soldiers of the Commonwealth of VIRGINIA.

THIS shall be your WARRANT to survey and lay off in one or more Surveys, for Moses Wade his Heirs or Assigns, the Quantity of one Hundred Acres of Land, due unto the said Moses Wade In consideration of his services for three years as a soldier in the Virginia Continental Line agreeable to a Certificate from the Governour and Council received into the Land Office.

GIVEN under my Hand, and the Seal of the said Office, this 12th Day of June in the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and 83.
