

Resolution of Citizens of Elizabeth City County, December 22, 1860, Executive Papers of Governor John Letcher, Acc. 36787, State Government Records Collection, Record Group 3, Library of Virginia

At a meeting of the Citizens of Elizabeth City Co. Viroinia, held in Hampton, Deche 22" 1860, on motion of Baker I. See, Dr. Dr ym R. Vaughan was elected President, and J. C. Phillips, Secretary. The following resolutions offered by I. M. Downer were unanimoust adouted !! Hygerens, the right of self government lies at the foundation of all pure republican institutions, and whereas the state of South Carolina be her ordinance of secepsion has affirmed this right, therefore e it resolved, that we as a people palous of our liberties, pledge ourscloses to sustain her in her independence, and solemich declare, that we utterte repudiate the despotio theory of coercion, as subversive of the great doctrine of State Sovereignty; Resolved, that we announce to the people of the North our wish for peace, but our determination? to meet the isud of war, if they persist in enforcing whon any Southern State the despotism of force, in opposition to the authoritatively expressed will of her people; Resolved that we unge upon our fellow citizens of Virginia the importance of organizing them, selves, in order, now that the argument is exhausted to be able to defend the cause of Constitutional Liberty, if need be, by an appeal to the God of Battles and the arbitrament of the second.
