We are gratified to see that the unsettled state of the country and tightness of the money market, have not stopped the progress of improvement in our town. Some four or five new tenement houses and two handsome brick private dwellings have been erected during the fall and winter. Mr. Tutwiler is about building a new house for the Bank, and the Messrs Pettigrew are about erecting a new building on their old stand, which, judging from the plan of the architect will be quite handsome and imposing. Both this and the house for the Bank, will have fronts of cut stone. Mr. Johnson is now making additions to his hotel building, which will add greatly to the capacity and comfort of his house.

At the Institute, the new house for the Superintendent is nearly completed. The magazine has been built and enclosed, and the north wing of the Barracks is in progress of erection.
