We the undersigned Citizens of Lunenburg County Virginia respectfully state that Col<sup>d</sup> troops have been ordered and are now quartered at our County Seat Our Citizens are quiet and orderly Submitting without exception to the new order of things The presence of these troops amongst us is very repugnant and humiliating to our feelings and we fear will result in improper and injurious influence on our former Slaves now inclined to be disorderly insolent and Vitious and we earnestly ask you to use your influance to have them removed or if necessary their place supplied by white troops.
